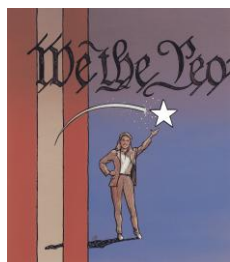
Mah Jongg – Jane Egermann, Activity Leader
