

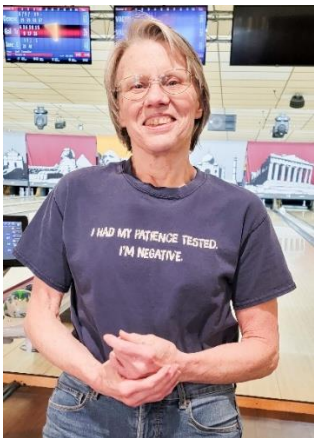

April showers may bring May flowers but the more important thing that April brings is the new mah jongg card! Hopefully, by now, all our regular players have received their new cards.

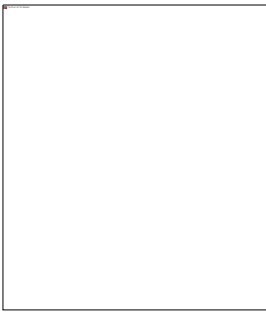

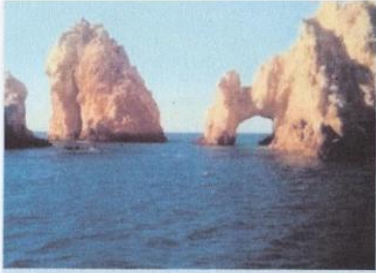
The group decided to keep our quarterly meeting format but to also start using our contact list to reach out to members to engage in activities in between our quarterly meetings to expand our horizons.

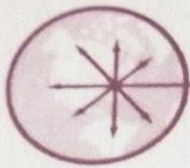
